Open services:

- 24-hour domestic violence hotline (*for all ages and genders, those who have or are experiencing intimate partner violence/domestic violence/teen dating violence and their allies*):

- One-on-one advocacy over the phone:

 - Current participants can leave a message for their advocate through the main office phone line (831) 426-3062 *Note: Staff extension list follows main office outgoing message*
 - Survivors who do not already have an advocate can call the main office number and request to make a phone appointment with an advocate.

- Youth mentoring over the phone (ages 12-17); please call our main office at (831) 426-3062 to leave a message for your youth advocate or to ask about this service.
